ABOUT THE SPEAKERS:

Dean Gilbert will be addressing Integrated Waste Management Planning. His talk will focus on:

- A brief overview of current projects within the Department of Environmental Affairs (Waste Directorate)
 - Development of the 2nd generation Integrated Waste Management Plan
 - Industry Waste Management Forum
 - Status Quo on Hazardous Waste in the Western Cape
 - Industry Waste Management Planning within the new legislative and policy context
- About Dean: Currently in the position of Assistant Manager, Waste Management Planning for the Waste Management Directorate within the Department of Environmental Affairs and Development Planning in the Western Cape, Dean holds a Masters in Philosophy (MPhil) Environmental Management from the University of Stellenbosch, having completed his undergraduate studies in Chemistry at UCT. He has worked in the Department for 9 years, with experience in Municipal Integrated Waste Management Planning, Industry Waste Management Planning, Hazardous Waste Management Planning, Waste Characterisation, Pollution and Emergency Incident Management and Chemicals Management. Before the department he was employed as an Analytical Chemist at the Warner Lambert, Pfizer, Johnson and Johnson. He also lectured at Cape Technical College in Mathematical and Engineering Science.

Zayed Brown will be speaking to us about Water for Growth, Water for the Environment. His presentation will describe the centrality of water to economic growth for socio- economic stability. It will focus on the various laws and regulations, major sources of pollution, management and current interventions being undertaken by, especially, the Provincial Government in terms of the Berg River Improvement Plan and the Environmental Resources Protection Plan (for the Breede River)

- About Zayed: He is currently the Head of Component for Pollution Monitoring and Information Management in the Department of Environmental Affairs and Development Planning of the Western Cape. He has a vast academic repertoire having completed studies at Peninsula Technikon, the University of Cape Town (UCT), the University of Stellenbosch (US) and the University of the Western Cape (UWC). He gained a great deal of experience whilst serving as the VLIR Water project manager at (UWC), a Chief Chemist, Crude Oil Scheduler and Pricing Risk manager at ENGEN Petroleum Products, Spectroscopist at UCT's Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Unit and an Analytical Chemist at Reckitt and Coleman.

Dieter Krug will be teaching us about Epoxy Coatings for Water and Waste Water Applications. In brief: Steel reinforced concrete is a strong and durable material used in water and waste water installations all over the world. Concrete structures deteriorate over time through exposure to chemical attack and corrosion of the internal steel reinforcement. Therefore, concrete structures would require protective coatings to ensure a long service life.

- About Dieter: A well- known figure in the SA coatings landscape, he is the Product Manager for Epoxy Curing Agents at Air Products, South Africa. He was born and raised in Germany, but has lived in South Africa since 1982, having been with Air Products since 1989. He is a licensed mechanic, holds qualifications in epoxy composite airframes and is a Business Management Graduate through Damelin.

Belinda Berry will be Simplifying the Waste Act for the Coatings Industry. She will present

- About Belinda: She is the owner / Managing Director of the ConnectMe Group, an independent Waste Management consultancy covering regulatory requirements as well as beneficiation options for waste streams. She is a registered Professional Natural Scientist who has been certified by UNITAR for the Classification and Labelling of hazardous substances and mixtures and hazard communication in terms of the UN Global Harmonised Standard (GHS) , She holds a Post graduate Diploma in Environmental law from the University of Natal (KZN), and an Honours degree in Organic and Organometallic Chemistry.

Darrin MComb will be discussing Cleaner Production - Its relevance and practical application.

- About Darrin: he is the Managing Director at Resource Innovations Africa. A Professional Scientist, Green Star Sa Accredited Professional Certified Energy manager, Darrin has focused on Waste Management, Cleaner Production and Sustainability over the past 15 years. He holds a Masters in Organisational Leadership and has completed his B.Sc Hons. Degree.
